# A Letter for November Remembrance

Have you seen the film 'Saving Private Ryan'? The first 20 minutes of the film is a powerful account of war, portraying the first landing crafts arriving at the Normandy beaches on D Day. The film successfully brings to life the events of that day, as a vivid act of remembrance.

From a biblical perspective, the word remembrance means making present a past reality, so that we can benefit from it today. On Remembrance Sunday we think about those who have given their lives in wars over the years, as well as those who continue to grieve over their lost loved ones. We want to make their sacrifice in past conflicts real for us today, so that we can engage with the horror of war and those enduring suffering today.

It involves dealing with the why question in the face of relentless tragedies and injustices: why does God allow such suffering to take place? One of the great themes of the Scriptures is that God identifies with the suffering. But the Christian faith goes beyond this! It affirms that in Jesus, God's Son, divinity became involved in suffering and death on

the cross. It is at Calvary that we see how God Himself knows what it is to lose a loved one in an unprovoked attack. 'I could never myself believe in God if it were not for the Cross. In the real world of pain, how could one worship a God who was immune to it?' (John Stott).

Although we don't fully understand the reason why God allows evil and suffering to continue, we do know what the reason isn't! It can't be that He doesn't love us! God so loved us and hates suffering that He was willing to come down and get involved in our hurting world. This can be a source of real strength on such an occasion.

However, how can we ensure that those who have given their lives are truly honoured, not forgetting those who are risking their lives in conflicts today? An appropriate response is to actively work and pray for justice in our world, especially where there is inequality and conflict. In a divided world we are also called to renew our efforts to work for peace. We need to be serious about being peacemakers, especially where it involves those close to us. As Jesus said, 'Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called sons of God' (Matt 5:9).

## Caring for Creation

This month sees the eagerly anticipated COP26 climate conference in Glasgow. As Christians, we need to hold together two key insights, if we are to engage with the challenge of climate change:

*The world is not ours:*

*'The earth is the Lord's and everything in it' (Psalm 24:1). The world is not ours, but God's!*

If we understand this, we will rediscover the responsibility of our calling to care for God's world: *'The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it.'* (Genesis 2:15).

This challenges our consumer mindset, that says the resources of the earth are both limitless and exist for our pleasure. As well as caring for the planet, we also need to care for its people, for it's the poorest who will suffer the most from climate change. According to the World Bank, 100 million could fall into

poverty by 2030. We cannot properly address the climate crisis until we re-learn our place in God's world!

*We belong to Christ:*

We also belong to the one in whom: *'all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him.'* (Colossians 1:16).

We can look forward to the climax of history when God will restore the broken world and make everything new. We are empowered by Christ to take our proper place as stewards of the earth, as we share in this hope. We are called to love God and neighbour, and care for the planet by living simply, recycling, conserving energy and choosing reusable options.

However great the climate crisis gets, as Christians, we can engage in it with faith and not with fatalism!

The gift tags will be available in church from Sunday November 14th.



Good News—with the lifting of the coronavirus restrictions we are now looking to relaunch our Creation exhibition in the Summer of 2022, so I'm appealing to everyone out there to help again make this theme as successful as Noah was in 2018.



As the darker nights creep upon us through the Autumn and Winter months, we would like as many people as possible to help with this project. So, if you know anyone who can knit, please ask them to help too. All knitted squares can be left in church, given to a member of the congregation who will bring them into church, or give them to the person who delivers your Parish Magazine.

To begin with, we are looking for squares in various shades of green, blue and brown. Over the next few

months, we will have updates on how the squares are coming along and what different colours we will be requiring to complete the project and of course more exact details about our exhibition date.

Again using our tried recipe of 4 inch knitted squares.



Our recipe is :  
using double knitting wool and size 4 mm needles (old number 8,) cast on 25 stitches, knit 45 rows then cast off, hopefully you will have a 4 inch knitted square –wonderful.

I am looking forward, together with many members of our church, to putting together this new project, so in anticipation of everyone's help, can I in advance thank everyone for helping out yet again.

## Latin Phrases Explained





## Recycling & Green Living Tips



### Is online grocery shopping greener than going to the supermarket?

During the pandemic, lots of people switched to online shopping, even for food. Businesses are hoping that a lot of us like the convenience enough that we'll want to keep having our shopping delivered even after the pandemic. But should we? Is grocery delivery better or worse for the environment than going to the shop?

In the days before we had fridges, it was common to have milk delivered to the doorstep. As online shopping became popular at the turn of the 21st century, Amazon and other retailers experimented with grocery delivery, but most people clung to the supermarket.

That changed over the years and accelerated during the pandemic; when nearly every supermarket chain built up their websites for online shopping with delivery and pickup. A 2013 study found that ordering groceries online could reduce carbon

emissions by 20% to 75%. But e-commerce has changed a lot since 2013; today, the answer to whether grocery delivery is greener is not quite so clear.

### Warehouse vs. Supermarket

A traditional supermarket is energy intensive. These large buildings must be maintained at a comfortable temperature for shoppers while simultaneously keeping food items refrigerated and frozen. Food in the grocery store has travelled from a warehouse – or several – through a complex distribution system.

Overstocking is standard (shoppers are more likely to buy from abundant-looking displays) and it's estimated that millions of tons of food waste are generated from supermarkets each year.

***If your groceries are delivered from the same store where you would shop in person, there is no environmental advantage.***

Secondary packaging for delivery – such as disposable bags, ice packs, and foam cushioning – is an additional source of waste. Some supermarkets have stopped using this. The number of delivery vehicles in cities is projected to rise which could lead to an increase in emissions and congestion. The delivery distance from a large warehouse generates more transportation emissions, and

there can be environmental issues with the siting of industrial-scale distribution centres

There are both environmental and ethical considerations related to delivery drivers. Employees are generally treated better than gig workers, who are not only more likely to be underpaid, but often must use their own (older, less efficient) vehicles. Amazon has ordered 100,000 electric delivery vans; delivery in an EV would be a better option than driving an internal combustion engine vehicle to the grocery store. (This is less significant in areas where electricity comes from coal or if delivery vans are refrigerated to keep food fresh.)

### **Which Is Better?**

Determining the environmental impact of e-commerce is complicated. The answer to whether grocery delivery is greener than a trip to the supermarket is, "It depends." And actually, that's good news. It means you can choose what works for you, and whatever you choose, you can do it more sustainably.

Consider the following:

Are you replacing a drive to the supermarket, or would you have walked or cycled instead?

Do your deliveries come from a local hub or a large, distant distribution centre?

Who makes the deliveries? Gig

workers in their own vehicles or employees in company-owned electric vehicles?

Do they deliver in reusable containers made from recycled materials or disposable ones made from virgin materials?

Do they deliver your groceries according to an algorithm that reduces delivery miles or at the time you specify?

Whether you shop in person or online, try to do all your shopping in one trip instead of making multiple small purchases; and remember that what you eat has a much bigger impact on your carbon footprint than how you buy it. If you have access to farmers' markets or local growers, then use them instead of the supermarket.
